

ADINKRA SYMBOLS

ADINKRA SYMBOLS

1. ABAN (Great fortress or Strong magnificent House). A symbol that legitimizes the power of the King or the Chief.



2. ADINKRAHENE – (Chief of the adinkra symbols) This is a symbol of greatness, charisma and leadership.




3. ANIBERE A ENNSO GYA - Literally meaning, Seriousness does not always show in red eyes. It connotes Defiance of odds and self-effacing in difficulties.



4. AKOBEN (War Horn)Signifies readiness to be called to arms and Preparedness for action or battle.



5. AKOFENA A symbol of authority and gallantry.



6. AKOKONAN TIABA (The leg of a hen) This symbol signifies the protective, corrective and loving nature of mothers for their children.




7. AKOMA

A symbol of patience and tolerance.



8. MPUANNUM (Five tufts of hair) This hair style is believed to symbolize adroitness.



9. AYA (FERN)


It connotes defiance.

This symbol signifies fondness for cleanliness and beauty in women.




12. DWENNI MMEN

This is the symbol of love, safety and Security.




14. EPA (Handcuffs)

15. ESE NE TEKEREMA (The teeth and the tongue). A symbol of friendship and interdependence.




16. FIHANKRA

A symbol of security and safety.




17. FOFOO (Seeds of a plant)

20. HWEMUDUA (Measuring stick).

This is a symbol of examination and quality control.




21. HYE-WO-HO-NHYE

23. MFRAMADAN (Airy house i.e. well ventilated house).

The symbol connotes fortitude and the readiness to face the rigours of life.




24. MMRA KRADO (Padlock of law i.e. seal of law)

This symbol encourages regular request to good omen from God.




26. NKONSONKONSON

This connotes readiness, valour and fearlessness.




35. ODO NNYEW FIE KWAN (Love never loses its way home).

This is symbol of freedom of speech.




38. PAGYA (Strike fire) A symbol for gunners and of bravery.
